

# Hockey Edmonton Lite Hockey Structure (2024-25)








## Three team Model & OEG Partnership

• Starting the 2022-23 season, Hockey Edmonton and Edmonton Oilers unveiled a pinnacle stream program that revolutionized elite hockey (U18 AAA) development in Edmonton. This will be the 'Cadillac brand' of hockey in Edmonton that all players will feel extreme pride to earn a position with.

• In a partnership the first of its kind in Canada, the Junior Oilers program is supported with access to world-class *NHL resources, opportunities, experiences, scholarships, and relationships.* 

• This program has been developed and maintained by local hockey development experts, using feedback from athletes, families, and Athletic Clubs. The Edmonton Junior Oilers program will aim to:

- Support the developmental demands and expectations of the Hockey Edmonton membership.
- Increase team performance.
- Increase player promotion.
- Adhere to Hockey Canada's high-performance pathway expectations.
- Compete with alternative programs (CSSHL, JPHL, HSL, etc.).

# **Program Logistics**

Teams will have a *consistent weekly development schedule from mid-September to the end of March.* Signage and advertisements will also be incorporated in the arena to make the facility feel like our home.

### **Bi-Weekly Schedule**

Exact dates and times are still TBD for the 2024-25 season, however over a *two-week period* each Junior Oilers team shall receive the following:

- 1. TWO Goalie Skill Development Sessions.
- 2. TWO Player Skill Development Sessions.
- 3. FOUR Team practices.
- 4. THREE Team workouts.
- 5. ONE Sports Psychology Session.
- 6. TWO Team Video Review Sessions.

All practices are scheduled between 5:30-8:00pm (No practice will start after 8:30pm).

Workouts/Video Review sessions are scheduled on practice days to limit travel.

## Team Formation (Blue/Orange - AEHL)

- Spring ID Camps will be utilized to evaluate players in addition to scouting, coach references and video reviews from past season.
- Returning Junior Oilers players will declare their desire to earn a position on the same team or return to the team draft for next season.
- All returning Junior Oilers players (declared or non) must earn a position in subsequent seasons.
- As per AEHL U18 AAA bylaws and policies, **SIX** players (maximum) can be "signed/committed" to before **June 20** each season.
- Tryouts begin end of August/early September.



## Team Formation (White -AFHL)

### • This is a recruitment-based program, much like NCAA, U Sports, ACAC programs.

- Spring ID Camps will be utilized to evaluate players in addition to scouting, coach references, and video reviews from past seasons.
- AFHL U18 AAA Regulations (April 15, 2024):
  - Up to SIX players can be "signed" before August 15 each season.
  - No more than **SEVEN** first year (15-year-old) players can be selected on each AFHL U18 AAA team.
  - All returning players (declared or non) must earn a position in subsequent seasons.
  - AFHL: Players who have completed one year or more U18 Female AAA must declare by May 30 that they wish to return to their current team. Associations are responsible for the formal commitment process. After May 30, players who have not formally recommitted to the team, will be considered eligible to move to another U18 AAA team.
  - AFHL: U18 AAA must invite a minimum of 25 athletes (no maximum) to Fall Tryouts. Any athlete who receives a U18 AAA Fall Camp Tryout has seven days within receipt of the invitation to inform the team of their intention to attend (or not attend) the tryout. Associations are responsible for management and acceptance of invitations. Teams are permitted to add players to the invitation/tryout list at any point during the tryout process, this includes second tryout skates.
  - Tryouts begin: end of August/early September.

## **Team Fees/Registration 2**

### Notes:

- A line-item budget will be presented to all families on **November 1, 2023.**
- This budget must be kept confidential within the team/club.
- Team White has a different budget than Team's Blue/Orange due to increased travel expenses (league and tournament).
- No cash calls will be executed outside of fees listed previously, unless required for provincial/Pacific/National tournaments. No fees will be returned to families at the end of season.
- All grants, sponsorships, excess fees, excess funding (Showcase revenue) are put directly back into the team budget.
- Circle K Tournament (Calgary, AB): this tournament is and invite only (per team) and would require an additional tournament fee of \$1,750 per player.
  - A team vote (to attend) would be executed to ensure transparency and fairness for families (70% of families must vote in favor).
